While the site is adjacent to residential uses and lacks precedent for this type of facility in the immediate area, the project's low-impact nature—being unmanned, non-polluting, and designed with screening and buffering—mitigates potential compatibility concerns.

The proposal touches on broader planning themes including **technological infrastructure**, **economic resilience**, and **urban service accessibility**, but does not meet the threshold for *strong* alignment due to the absence of direct, explicit support for telecommunications land use within neighborhood mixed-use areas in the Comprehensive Plan.
