

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-R-114

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF LAREDO AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO APPROVE AND ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) BETWEEN THE CITY OF LAREDO, TEXAS (“CITY”) AND THE COUNTY OF WEBB (COUNTY) FOR COST-SHARING OF THE LOCAL MATCH REQUIREMENT FOR THE TEXAS PARKS AND WILDLIFE (TPWD) UNDER THE OUTDOOR RECREATION LEGACY PARTNERSHIP (ORLP) 2023 GRANT PROGRAM. GRANT FUNDS WILL IMPROVE EXISTING TRAILS AND EMBANKMENTS ALONG ZACATE CREEK, AS WELL THE DEVELOPMENT OF NEWLY EXTENDED TRAILS, AND IMPROVE RECREATIONAL ACCESSIBILITY TO SURROUNDING NEIGHBORHOODS. THE CITY WILL CONTRIBUTE UP TO \$1,799,996.00 AND THE COUNTY WILL CONTRIBUTE UP TO \$2,000,000.00. FUNDING FOR THE CITY IS AVAILABLE IN THE 2019 CERTIFICATE OF OBLIGATION ISSUE, IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS OF LAND, PRIVATE DONATIONS, AND LAND VALUE.

Whereas, the City of Laredo has received funds from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) under the Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership (ORLP) 2023 Grant program (the “Grant”) to support improvement of existing trails and embankments along Zacate Creek, as well the development of newly extended trails, and improve recreational accessibility to surrounding neighborhoods.

Whereas, the Grant requires a local match contribution as a condition of funding; and

Whereas, the City of Laredo and the County of Webb share a mutual interest in the successful implementation of the proposed projects and its benefits to residents; and

Whereas, the County of Webb has agreed to contribute a portion of the required local match,

Whereas, the respective responsibilities of the City and County, including financial contributions, will be set forth in a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAREDO THAT:

Section 1: Authorizing the City Manager to approve and enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City of Laredo, Texas (“City”) and the County of Webb (County) for cost-sharing of the local match requirement for the Texas Parks and Wildlife (TPWD) under the Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership (ORLP) 2023 grant program. Grant funds will improve existing trails and embankments along Zacate Creek, as well the development of newly extended

trails, and improve recreational accessibility to surrounding neighborhoods. The City will contribute up to \$1,799,996.00 and the County will contribute up to \$2,000,000.00. Funding for the city is available in the 2019 Certificate of Obligation issue, in-kind contributions of land, private donations, and land value.

Section 2: This Resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its passage.
