### MINUTE ORDER

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ALL District

The Texas Transportation Commission (commission) desires to award a total of \$83,773,341 in state and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) program funds to support a variety of public transportation needs in rural and urbanized areas of the state.

Of the amounts appropriated to the Texas Department of Transportation (department) by the General Appropriations Act of the 88th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, \$73,752,134 was appropriated for urban and rural public transportation systems for the 2024-2025 biennium. Title 43, Texas Administrative Code (TAC), §31.11 establishes a formula by which state public transportation funds shall be distributed to the large urban, small urban and rural areas of the state. An award of \$35,857,674 of fiscal year (FY) 2025 state funds to the transit district(s) serving the large and small urbanized areas identified in exhibit A and to rural transit districts included in exhibit A and has been determined in accordance with §31.11. An award of \$583,862 also shown in exhibit A has been determined in accordance with §31.13 to mitigate impacts from the 2020 census and the pandemic in formula calculations.

Title 43, TAC, §31.36(f)(4) establishes a formula by which public transportation funds shall be distributed under the FTA Formula Grants for Rural Areas program (49 U.S.C. §5311). An award of \$47,331,805 of federal §5311 funds is shown in exhibit B and has been determined in accordance with §31.36(f)(4).


Transportation Code, Chapter 455 assigns a broad spectrum of public transportation roles and missions to the department.


Transportation Code, Chapter 456 authorizes the commission to administer funds appropriated for public transportation.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the commission that the executive director or the director's designee is directed to proceed with the awards in exhibits A and B, submit the necessary state application to the FTA, and enter into the necessary contracts.
