Annual Public Arts Plan- Evaluation Criteria

Evaluation Panel Committee Composition

While the evaluation panel committee aims to include seven members, it will always consist of an odd number and no fewer than three evaluators to ensure diverse perspectives and minimize score clustering. For public art projects requiring a formal bid process, the evaluation panel committee will be composed of City of Laredo employees, with panelists selected according to the project's scope and location.

- o **Three (3)** qualified Texas visual art professionals (e.g. curators, museum directors, art historians/ academics, Art in Public Places program administrators, experienced public artists). These panelists shall serve for one-year or two-year terms, and shall sit on all selection panels during their terms.
- o Two (2) representative members of the community where the specific project will be located
- One (1) member of the Fine Arts and Culture Commission (e.g. from the District in which the project is located)
- One (1) Project Designer for the CIP project (if artwork is integrated) or their designee of City Department liaison with jurisdiction.

The evaluation panel committee will provide its recommendation to the Public Art Program Manager and the corresponding Department Director.

Conflict of Interest

Evaluators must disclose any actual, potential, or perceived conflict of interest with any artists and/or organization. Any conflict requires immediate recusal from discussion, evaluation, and scoring to ensure a fair and impartial selection process. All evaluators, artists and/or organizations are required to sign the City of Laredo Conflict of Interest Clause before participating.

AI Disclaimer

Submissions generated by Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools must be the original work of the submitting artist, organization, or writer and may not rely solely on AI-generated content. AI may be used as a supportive tool (for editing, or refining ideas), but the final entry must clearly demonstrate the artist's or writer's own creative work. Works that are entirely AI-generated will not be accepted.

Evaluation Scoring

Each submitted proposal will be reviewed by an objective evaluation panel committee. Evaluations will be based on the key criteria outlined in the following documents:

- o Request for Qualification Evaluation Score Sheet
- o Request for Proposal Evaluation Score Sheet
- o Creative Writing Contest Evaluation Sheet
- Mini Gallery Post Evaluation Score Sheet

Proposals should also consider the recommended design approach, as detailed in the following section.
