DATE: 7/22/2024	SUBJECT: Resolution #2024-R-211 AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO RATIFY THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION IN THE ESTIMATED AMOUNT OF \$1,725,392.00 TO THE TEXAS MOTOR VEHICLE CRIME PREVENTION AUTHORITY FOR THE FY25 SB 224 CATALYTIC CONVERTER GRANT FOR THE PERIOD OF SEPTEMBER 1, 2024 THROUGH AUGUST 31, 2025. THE PURPOSE OF THIS GRANT PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR THE LAREDO AUTO THEFT TASK FORCE/LAREDO POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR THE DETECTION AND PREVENTION OF CATALYTIC CONVERTER THEFT. THIS GRANT WILL PAY FOR THE SALARY OF A FULL-TIME ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEY, TECHNOLOGY, TRAINING, AND OVERTIME. THE CITY'S CASH MATCH WILL BE TRANSFERRED FROM GENERAL FUND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$443,363.00 FOR A TOTAL GRANT AMOUNT OF \$2,168,755.00. FUNDING WILL BE AVAILABLE IN THE AUTO THEFT TASK FORCE FUND.

BACKGROUND: The Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority (MVCPA) has authorized the issuance of the Fiscal Year 2025 Request Applications (RFA) Senate Bill 224 provides that, "The money deposited to the credit of the general revenue fund for coordinated regulatory and law enforcement activities intended to detect and prevent catalytic converter theft in this state may be appropriated to the Authority for the activities required by this section." To implement SB 224, the MVCPA is providing grants to local law enforcement taskforces and agencies to combat Catalytic Converter Theft. All applications submitted will be for FY2025. If awarded an FY2025 SB 224 Catalytic Converter Grant, the MVCPA may provide a FY 2026 grant subject to availability of funding and grantees' positive program performance. The MVCPA will use the same FY2025 application and prorated budget values as originally submitted for the additional period. Any ongoing program (scope) changes or budget changes will be submitted by grantees through the grant adjustment process after the creation of the second-year grants.

THE CITY'S CASH MATCH WILL BE TRANSFERRED FROM GENERAL FUND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$443,363.00 FOR A TOTAL GRANT AMOUNT OF \$2,168,755.00. FUNDING WILL BE AVAILABLE IN THE AUTO THEFT TASK FORCE FUND.

Whereas, the City of Laredo finds it in the best interest of the citizens of Laredo that the FY 2025 SB 224 Catalytic Converter Grant Program be operated for the 2024-2025 fiscal year; and

Whereas, the City of Laredo designated the City Manager as the grantee's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter or terminate this grant on behalf of the City of Laredo; and

Whereas, the City of Laredo has agreed that in the event of loss or misuse of the grant funds, the City of Laredo assures that the funds will be returned in full to the Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAREDO THAT:

Section 1: Authorizing the City Manager to ratify the submission of a grant application in the estimated amount of \$1,725,392.00 to the Texas Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority for the FY25 SB 224 Catalytic Converter Grant for the period of September 1, 2024 through August 31, 2025. The purpose of this grant program is to provide additional funding for the Laredo Auto Theft Task Force/Laredo Police Department for the detection and prevention of catalytic converter theft. This grant will pay for the salary of a full-time Assistant District Attorney, technology, training, and overtime. The city's cash match will be transferred from General Fund in the amount of \$443,363.00 for a total grant amount of \$2,168,755.00. Funding will be available in the Auto Theft Task Force Fund.
