SUBJECT: Resolution #2024-R-192 DATE: 6/24/2024 AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO RATIFY THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION IN THE ESTIMATED AMOUNT OF \$1,401,606.00 TO THE TEXAS MOTOR VEHICLE CRIME PREVENTION AUTHORITY (MVCPA) TO FUND THE LAREDO AUTO THEFT TASK FORCE FOR THE PERIOD OF SEPTEMBER 1, 2024 THROUGH AUGUST 31, 2025. THIS GRANT PAYS FOR SALARIES, SUPPLIES, AND EQUIPMENT FOR THE LPD AUTO THEFT UNIT. THE CITY'S LOCAL MATCH IS \$518,328.00 FOR A TOTAL GRANT AMOUNT OF \$1,919,934.00. Rodriguez, Jr. Chief of Police City Manager PREVIOUS COUNCIL ACTION: None. **BACKGROUND:** Established by the 72<sup>nd</sup> Texas Legislature in 1991, the Texas Automobile Theft Prevention Authority (ATPA) became the first statewide effort to reduce auto theft. The 80<sup>th</sup> Legislature amended the ATPA mission in House Bill 1887 to also emphasize reducing vehicle burglaries. The resulting agency, the Texas Auto Burglary and Theft Prevention Authority (ABTPA), is in charge with assessing automobile burglary, theft, and economic theft (burglary or theft committed for financial gain) in Texas, analyzing the methods and providing financial support to combat the problems. In 2009, the ABTPA became part of a newly established Texas Department of Motor Vehicles. The name was changed to Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority in 2019. The Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority (MVCPA) authorized the issuance of the Fiscal Year 2025 Request for Applications (RFA) MVCPA is authorized in statue to provide grants to local law enforcement to combat motor vehicle theft, burglary from a motor vehicle and/or fraudrelated motor vehicle crime. **FINANCIAL IMPACT:** Funding is available in the Special Police Fund. **COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:** STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Recommends the approval of this Resolution.

Whereas, under the provisions of the Texas Transportation Code Chapter 1006 and Texas Administrative Code Title 43; Part 3; Chapter 57, entities are eligible to receive grants from MVCPA to provide financial support to law enforcement agencies for economic motor vehicle theft and fraud-related motor vehicle crime enforcement teams; and

**Whereas**, this grant program will assist this jurisdiction to combat motor vehicle theft, motor vehicle burglary and fraud-related motor vehicle crime; and

**Whereas**, the City of Laredo has designated Steve E. Landin, Assistant City Manager as the Authorized Official; Francisco J. Mata, Financial Services Director as the Financial Officer; and Chief of Police Miguel A. Rodriguez, Jr. as the Program Director; and

**Whereas**, the Assistant City Manager is designated as the Authorized Official to apply for, accept, decline, modify, or cancel the grant application for the Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority Grant Program and all other necessary documents to accept said grant; and

Whereas, the City of Laredo has agreed that in the event of loss or misuse of the Office of the Governor funds, the City of Laredo assures that the funds will be returned to the Office of the Governor in full.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAREDO THAT:

**Section 1**: Authorizing the City Manager to ratify the submission of a grant application in the estimated amount of \$1,401,606.00 to the Texas Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority (MVCPA) to fund the Laredo Auto Theft Task Force for the period of September 1, 2024 through August 31, 2025. This grant pays for salaries, supplies, and equipment for the LPD Auto Theft Unit. The city's local match is \$518,328.00 for a total grant amount of \$1,919,934.00. Funding is available in the Auto Theft Task Force Fund.
