Subject: Request for Replacement of Bucket Trucks Due to Safety, Reliability, and

Maintenance Burden

Dear Mr. Chavez,

I am writing to request urgent action regarding the replacement of our department's bucket trucks, which have become increasingly unreliable and costly to maintain.

Background:

Our fleet was reduced from four to three bucket trucks following a **fire incident in June 2024**, which destroyed Unit 2511 while it was in for service. Although insurance provided partial coverage, it **did not cover the full cost of replacement**, leaving us short one critical vehicle.

Current Fleet Status:

We now operate Units 2773, 2774, and 2628—all of which have experienced significant mechanical and safety issues:

Units 2773 & 2774:

- Traction control problems causing wobbling while driving
- Multiple hydraulic system failures
- Active recalls for brake pressure switch (fire hazard) and engine control module
- Unit 2774 experienced a drive shaft detachment while in motion

Unit 2628:

- Has been largely out of service this year due to extensive hydraulic system failures
- * Maintenance Costs to Date: (see attached)

• Truck 2773: \$27,745.32

• Truck 2774: \$17,855.49

Truck 2628: \$70,015.79



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These figures reflect an unsustainable financial burden and a serious risk to staff safety and operational continuity.

Replacement Options:

We have received quotations for new bucket trucks from Versalift:

- Premium Option (In-Stock):
 Ron Miller is holding a ready-to-deliver unit for us at a premium price of \$204,000.
- Standard Build Option:
 A new bucket truck can be custom-built for \$184,000 with a lead time of approximately 90–120 days.
- Current Budget Estimate:
 Our allocated budget is \$173,000, which falls short of both options.

Recommendation:

Given the urgency of our operational needs and the safety risks posed by our current fleet, I recommend we pursue the **in-stock premium unit** if funding can be identified quickly. Alternatively, we should begin procurement for the standard build and explore supplemental funding to cover the budget gap.

I am available to discuss funding strategies, procurement timelines, and provide full documentation as needed.

Thank you for your attention to this matter. We need our trucks.
